

As the only private property on Round Lake, Superior National Forest land surrounds Tuscarora. Pull up our driveway and you'll be deeper in the woods than most people ever get. Our location provides easy access to some of the most remote areas in Minnesota-Canadian wilderness. Begin your wilderness canoe adventure directly from either of our docks on Round or Saganaga Lakes, or at any of several entry points nearby.

## What we do...

### Plan your trip

We can walk you through the countless BWCAW/Quetico route options and provide firsthand insight. We take pride in listening carefully to your needs and helping shape a Boundary Waters trip that's just right for you. When you call, we'll discuss how many miles you hope to paddle each day, if you prefer large or small waters, if you'll be fishing, if you'll be traveling with kids, if you're hoping to spot any specific wildlife or wildflowers, and any other special needs you have for your trip.

### Secure your permit

The BWCAW and Quetico parks have daily entry quotas. We reserve your permit as soon as you make your reservation. You can pick up your BWCAW permit at Tuscarora. Quetico permits are issued at the Canadian Ranger Station in Saganaga Lake's Cache Bay.

### Supply your equipment

We know you want the latest in ultralight gear. We stay on top of industry trends and outfit you with the cleanest and best maintained gear in the BWCAW. Whether you're a canoe country newbie without any camping equipment of your own or you're a Boundary Waters veteran who just needs a canoe, we've got you covered.



### Pack your food

We assemble a lightweight food pack with conveniently packaged high quality fresh and freeze-dried foods. You'll enjoy tasty, quickly prepared meals with generous portions. View our camping menu online.

### Provide a private bunkhouse

Get an early start to your trip by staying overnight in one of our private bunkhouses the night before your trip. These simple accommodations provide you with a clean, quiet place to make your final packing decisions and prepare to embark.

### Serve your breakfast

We serve our famous French toast breakfast in our dining hall every morning from May 1 - September 30. You won't want to skip this Tuscarora tradition before you start your trip.

### Help with whatever you forgot

Whether you need bait, toothpaste, or a souvenir t-shirt, you'll find what you need in our fully stocked gift shop.

### Provide tow service on Saganaga Lake

Our motorized tow service gives you a head start and saves you approximately six hours of paddling across Saganaga Lake. If you're headed into Quetico Provincial Park, our tow service can get you to the Canadian Ranger Station first thing in the morning.

### Offer fishing advice

This region boasts excellent fishing for multiple species, including lake trout, walleye, northern pike, and bass. We'll advise you on recommended fishing areas as well as the preferred bait and lures.



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**Suggested Canoe Routes** These are just a few of the many canoe routes in our immediate area. **Tuscarora West Route** averages 4 to 7 days and is moderately difficult. The loop starts at our dock on Round Lake. Portage to Missing Link, Tuscarora, Owl, Crooked, Gillis, Bat, Green, Flying, Gotter, Brant, Edith, West Round and end at Round Lake. Fishing includes Lake Trout and Northern Pike.

**Cross Bay to Poplar Route** starts at the Cross Bay Lake landing just down our driveway, and is considered moderately difficult. Travel south through Ham, Cross Bay, Rib, Lower George, Karl, Long Island, Muskeg, Kiskadinna, Omega, Henson, Gaskin, Horseshoe, Caribou, Lizz and finish at Poplar Lake. Walleyes, Northern Pike, Smallmouth Bass, and Lake Trout. This route takes an average of 4 days and features 21 moderate portages.

**Border Route (Seagull to Saganaga)** Starts at Seagull Lake. Travel to Alpine, Jasper, Kingfisher, Ogishkemuncie, Eddy, South Arm of Knife, turn north to Hanson, Ester, Ottertrack, and end on Saganaga. This moderately difficult trip takes an average of 4-5 days. Excellent fishing for Walleye, Smallmouth Bass, Northern Pike and Lake Trout. Some larger lakes make it possible to see a lot of land without excessive portaging.

**Seagull to Saganaga** Starts at Seagull Lake. Travel to Alpine, Jasper, Kingfisher, Ogishkemuncie, Eddy, Knife, Ottertrack, and end on Saganaga. This trip takes an average of 5 days, has 9 portages, and offers the same great fishing as in the Border Route.

**Granite River Route** Start at the Gunflint Lake landing and travel north via an old Voyageur route up the Granite River through Clove, Gneiss, Devil's Elbow, and Maraboeuf Lakes, ending at Saganaga Lake. End at Saganaga. This scenic trip with some rapids to portage around is considered fairly easy, and takes an average of 4 days. Great fishing for Smallmouth Bass, Walleyes and Northern Pike.

**Fall Chain to Kawnipi Route** is a challenging, more advanced trip within Canada's Quetico Park that takes an average of 7 days. Start at Saganaga, go to Cache Bay on the Canadian side, then to Saganagons. Take the Falls Chain to Kawnipi Lake and return by this same gorgeous waterfall route. Excellent fishing for Walleye, Smallmouth Bass, Lake Trout and Northern Pike. To save you up to six hours of paddling on either end of your trip, take a tow boat shuttle across Saganaga Lake to Hook Island.

**Saganaga Lake Base Camp** is an easy 4-day trip by canoe or kayak on Saganaga Lake only. Start at Tuscarora private dock at Saganaga, travel to American Point on Day One. On Day Two, travel to Red Rock Bay for your second night camping. Day Three travel east to James Bay and stay for your last night. Return to Saganaga dock. No portaging necessary as you explore this large lake. Excellent fishing for Walleye, Smallmouth Bass, Lake Trout and Northern Pike.

**Round Lake to Seagull Route** a challenging 8-10 day trip that starts at Round Lake. Travel to Missing Link, Tuscarora, Owl, Crooked, Mora, Little Saganaga, turn south to Elton, Bear, Pan, through the Kawishiwi River to Alice, Insula, north to Thomas, Frazer, Kekekabic, then east to Ogishkemuncie, Jasper, Alpine, and end at Seagull. This adventure takes you through the best canoe country in Minnesota and is very remote. Excellent fishing for Walleye, Smallmouth Bass, Lake Trout and Northern Pike.

# Tow Service

Get yourself and your gear across Saganaga Lake fast. Our motorized tow service saves you a good six hours of paddling, whether you're headed into Quetico Provincial Park, down the U.S./Canadian border past American Point, or to the Granite River or Red Rock Lake. Tow rates below are per person.

## Shuttle Service to Landings

Whichever Gunflint Trail Boundary Waters entry point you choose, we'll get you there. Shuttles are complementary to our outfitting clients within nine miles of Tuscarora's Round Lake property. Shuttles more than nine miles away incur a charge of \$2.00/vehicle/mile each way from our base.

# Policies

## Remote Area Border Crossing Permit (RABC)/U.S. Passports

Anyone entering Canada through border lakes must apply for a CANPASS-Remote Area Border Crossing permit (RABC). The applications are processed through the Canadian Immigration Center (807) 624-2162; [www.cic.gc.ca](http://www.cic.gc.ca). A link to the application is also available on the "Links" page of our web site ([www.tuscaroracanoes.com/links/](http://www.tuscaroracanoes.com/links/)). The processing can take up to 6 weeks, must be handled through the mail, and will cost \$30/person (or family). You cannot cross into Canada remotely without this permit. U.S. Passports are required for re-entry to the United States.



## Reservations

We require a \$100 deposit per person for complete outfitting, \$50 per person for partial outfitting, plus applicable permit fees on your VISA or Mastercard. You can reserve your trip at any time at 218-388-2221 or start the reservation process at [tuscaroracanoes.com](http://tuscaroracanoes.com). Guests are responsible for all days reserved; we do not issue refunds for early returns. If cancellations are received 60 days prior to arrival, deposits will be refunded less 20% handling costs.



## Season & Hours

The canoe season starts May 1 and runs through mid-October. We are open every day during canoe season, including Sundays and holidays. Breakfast is served May 1 – September 30; reservations required.

## Office Hours

May 1 – Memorial Day weekend: 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Memorial Day weekend – Labor Day: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

After Labor Day: 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

## Permits

We will secure your required BWCAW permit to be picked up at Tuscarora, or arrange for a Quetico permit to be issued at the Canadian Ranger Station in Cache Bay. To ensure your choice of date and route, we like to apply for these limited permits as soon as possible. Traveling groups are strictly limited to nine people. If your group has more than nine, we will obtain different permits to facilitate different travel routes.

## Is this your first trip?

Don't worry! Many of our visitors are first time BWCAW paddlers. You'll have plenty of time to go over your questions and concerns before your trip. We'll orient you to the woods, introduce your gear, provide camping and orienteering tips, choose the right trip for you, and make sure you're comfortable with your canoe before you head out.



# Housekeeping Cabins

Tuscarora offers six housekeeping cabins located on Round Lake. There are no other resorts or private homes here, making our cabins a peaceful secluded place to stay no matter which season you visit. From your cabin on Round Lake, you will have direct access to the BWCAW.



All of our cabins have complete kitchen and bathroom facilities. Cabin rental includes sheets, towels, kitchen utensils, and firewood. Surrounded by Superior National Forest, you will vacation comfortably in the midst of wilderness.

## To make your reservation:

Call us at (800) 544-3843.

A \$250 deposit is required at the time of your reservation. Your deposit is applied towards the total cost of your stay. Deposits will be refunded less 20% handling costs, if cancellation is received 60 days in advance of scheduled arrival.

- Check in time is 3 p.m.
- Check out time is 10 a.m.
- A \$250 deposit is required at time of reservation.
- Minimum summer reservation is three consecutive nights.
- Guests are responsible for all nights reserved; we do not issue refunds for early departures.
- Dining room open for 7 a.m. breakfast May 1- September 30 with advance reservation.
- One boat or one aluminum canoe is included in the rental of cabin; motor is extra.
- Other rentals (discounted for cabin guests only): Canoe, boat or motor: \$28/day; \$155/week
- Ask about the availability of retreat facilities.
- Cabins 3, 5 and Historic Lakeside Lodge open all year.
- All Tuscarora buildings are smoke free.
